Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Good news! It is February! That means we can almost begin to think about spring, even if it isn't exactly around the corner just yet. One of the other things we inevitably think about in February is Valentine's Day and Valentine's Day typically makes us think about love. So I can't quite resist love being the topic of this month's letter from the pastor.

As Christians, we experience God's love for us everyday and we have learned and continue to learn how we can share that love with others. We reach out to those who suffer from natural disasters, whether it was a hurricane in Mississippi or an earthquake in Haiti. We encourage and pray for one another when we are struggling or suffering. We celebrate the milestones in each other's lives. We do all these things because Jesus has taught us to do them out of love. Yet no matter how hard we try to imitate Christ we still sometimes find it hard to know for sure if others are seeing God's love in our actions.

A while ago my husband, Paul, and our son, Evan, were playing together. Evan was starting to get bored, so Paul suggested they play "I Spy." Most of us have probably played this game, but basically the players take turns looking around the room saying, "I spy...a lamp. I spy...a couch, etc." So Paul and Evan each had a few rounds of spying different things and then Evan said, "Daddy, I spy love in your heart."

Clearly, Evan has seen Paul's love for him in Paul's actions and words. Evan can't, of course, really see Paul's love for him with his eyes, but that love is so clear in how Paul treats him that Evan, with the insight of a child, can still say that he "sees" Paul's love for him.

It is the same way for us as Christians. When we know that God loves us, when we feel his love and experience it, it is real to us even if not physically visible. In turn, then, we make that love “visible” for others, without even realizing it sometimes, so that people look at us and say, “Christian, I spy love in your heart.”

So if we find ourselves wondering if we are really making the love of God known to others in our words and actions, remember that people do spy God’s love in us through our constant, daily witness to the presence and joy of His love. May we all live as beloved followers of Christ who have God’s love shining out of our hearts, clearly visible for the whole world to see, believing fully that “they’ll know we are Christians by our love, by our love, yes they’ll know we are Christians by our love.”

Lenten Devotional

Ash Wednesday, February 17

Right now it’s hard to imagine that Ash Wednesday/the beginning of Lent is just a few weeks away—February 17, to be exact. A Time of Pondering - God is With us!

January started a new beginning. All the busyness of the holiday season has come and gone. Our Christmas tree is down, decorations once again safely stored. The glitter is over except for the snow. After the events surrounding the birth of Jesus, “*Mary treasured up all of these things and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds went back, singing praises to God for all they had heard and seen; it had been just as the angel had told them.*” (Luke 2:19-20 NIV)

Now, like Mary, January is the perfect time for us to get in our “pondering” mode. Over the next couple of weeks, give yourself the gift of time to ponder about events of the past year--how have you experienced the love of Christ? What are your hopes and dreams for the coming year? Moravian Music—Feb. 6 & 7

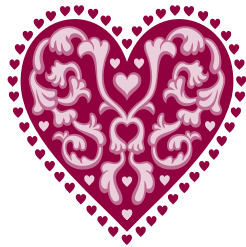

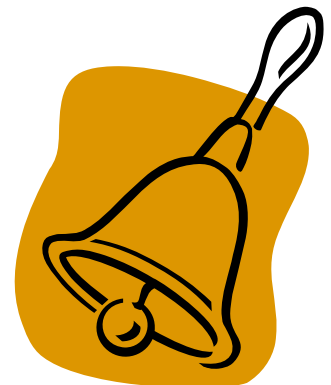

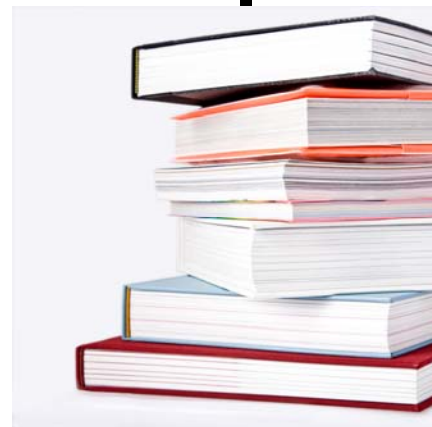

*Letter from Brother Mark Ebert, Board of World Mission

“Sisters and Brothers,

I am writing to you in hopes to help you understand what we as MVR are doing to do our part in the relief effort in Haiti. As I have written to you before, please continue to pray for all involved. As we continue to pray and ask God for guidance we are looking into ways in which we can be as effective as we can be. In the past we have found that Moravians are so much better on the long term recovery because of our size and resources. Our size does not mean that we are not as effective, we have been the vehicle of God's love to many souls that have seen desperate times and this time will be no different.

“I have received many phone calls and emails asking what as Moravians are we going to do and I feel that there is confusion among you, so let me try and explain. We are going to allow the Professionals to do what they do best, go in and establish an environment in which we and others will be able to go in make a long term impact on these people's lives. This is what Moravians do best, it is our gift! One option we are considering is to buy a shipping container full of dehydrated food products, just add water and boil. This is something that will be needed for years to come, but with all the aid flowing into Haiti right now, we would not purchase and ship these products until they are needed. This is one of many options we are considering, but most of these options will be aimed toward a long term recovery!

“All of this will take money, your money, God's money. If you feel you are led to give now, by all means, give, give to the organization of your choice, but know at some point we will ask you again, will you give?

“If you feel led to give to MVR for a future long term recovery effort , please send your contribution to the Board of World Mission , designated for MVR RESPONSE, PO box 1245 Bethlehem PA 18016-1245.

“I know how hard it is to watch and hear of the cries of desperate people, I am constantly in the midst of people that are in some form of need, many of whom have been desperate for some time. May we be as desperate to call on our God and ourselves to bring to an end all of this suffering, even, come Lord Jesus!”

MORAVIAN 101

The following is taken from The Moravian Covenant for Christian Living, Formerly known as The Brotherly Agreement of the Moravian Church, pages 8-9.

The Unity We Seek

We will have fellowship, in all sincerity, with children of God in other Christian churches, and will carefully avoid all disputes respecting opinion and ceremonies peculiar to one or another church. In this fellowship we will cooperate with other churches in the support of public charities or Christian enterprises, which have a just claim upon us as followers of the Lord Jesus Christ.

We realize that it is the Lord's will that the Church of Jesus Christ should give evidence of and seek unity in Him with zeal and love. We see how such unity has been promised us and laid upon us as a charge. We recognize that through the grace of Christ the different denominations have received many gifts and that the Church of Christ may be enriched by these many and varied contributions.

It is our desire that we may learn from one another and rejoice together in the riches of the love of Christ and the manifold wisdom of God. We welcome every step that brings us nearer the goal of unity in Him.
